Broward County Commission Libraries Division Announces
Late Opening for Tyrone Bryant Branch on May 4

BROWARD COUNTY, FL – A test will be conducted at Osswald Park on Thursday, May 4 that will alter the normal opening time for the Tyrone Bryant Branch Library, 2230 N.W. 21 Avenue, Fort Lauderdale.

The library, normally scheduled to open at noon, will not open until 2 p.m. on that day because the park will be closed to the public and there will be no access to the library. The library's hours on Thursday, May 4 will be 2 p.m. to 8 p.m. This is a one-time event that will not impact future service hours.

The Office of Emergency Operations of the Florida Department of Health, in coordination with the Center for Disease Control and the Department of Homeland Security, will be conducting a test and exercises to determine the State of Florida's ability to deliver pharmaceuticals to citizens during a Weapons of Mass Destruction event.
