**Literary Cinema Grand Finale and Art Exhibit at Main Library on May 13**

BROWARD COUNTY, FL – Literary Cinema’s season finale will close with a showing of *The Shootist*, accompanied by a special exhibit of the Western art of award-winning model builder Vivian R. Clark, at 1 p.m. on Saturday, May 13 in the Main Library auditorium, 100 S. Andrews Ave., Fort Lauderdale.

Glendon Swarthout’s *The Shootist* stars Ron Howard, James Stewart, Lauren Bacall and John Wayne in his final role as the legendary shootist.

In honor of the Western theme, Literary Cinema will showcase the Western models of Vivian R. Clark during show time only. The following pieces will be on display: “The Pony Soldier,” a 1/8” scale bust of John Wayne that earned a blue ribbon; “Marshall,” which won a Certificate of Merit at the World Hobby Expo in Boston in 2005; and “Canoe,” which earned a first place prize at the recent Dade County Fair. Also shown will be the award-winning pieces “Chuck Wagon,” “The Marshall’s Office” and “The Army Wagon” and a work in progress, “Stagecoach.” Vivian R. Clark is a member of The Historical Ship Modelers Society.
