Broward County Commission Libraries Division Announces
Friends Win Outstanding Program Award

BROWARD COUNTY, FL – The Broward County Friends of the Library received the Outstanding Program Award from the Florida Library Association – Friends Award 2006 for their “Hats Off to Friends” luncheon. The “Hats Off to Friends” luncheon, held June 16, 2005, honored the contributions of the Friends chapters who support Broward County Library’s 37 locations as well as to build a sense of unity and cohesiveness among the 29 Friends chapters that are currently active.

“It is wonderful that our ‘Hats Off to Friends’ program has been recognized as an Outstanding Program,” says Cynthia Shulman, manager of Broward County Library’s Main Library. “The Friends are an integral part of our library, giving generously of their time and lending support. The Outstanding Program Award is one of four prestigious awards given out annually by the Florida Library Association. The awards were announced and presented on April 20, 2006 at the Friends Luncheon during the Florida Library Association Conference in Orlando, Florida.

Founded in 1974, the award winning Broward County Libraries Division provides essential quality of life community service as well as outstanding customer service throughout Broward County. The library consists of a Main Library in Downtown Fort Lauderdale and 37 branches with more than three million items for public use. Broward
