Painters of Cap Haïtien Artwork Exhibit May 6 Through June 24

BROWARD COUNTY, FL – Broward County Library will display the “The Painters of Cap Haïtien Artwork Exhibit” starting Friday, May 6 through Friday, June 24 at the African-American Research Library and Cultural Center (AARLCC), 2650 Sistrunk Blvd., Fort Lauderdale.

Entitled Haiti’s First 200 Years, the exhibition will feature more than eighty works by outstanding Cap Haïtien and Milot painters depicting and celebrating Haitian history, daily life and visions for the future. An opening reception will be held at 7 p.m. on Friday, May 6.

In conjunction with the exhibit a film screening will be presented as part of the AARLCC Film Series at 2 p.m. on Sunday, May 1. The film, “Haiti: Through My Eyes,” features Haitian model and actress Lutza who portrays a sea goddess revealing the history of Haiti to an upcoming artist.
